### Open Circle Outcomes:

**Open Circle is a leading provider of evidence-based professional development and curricula for social and emotional learning (SEL) in Kindergarten through Grade 5.**

Since its inception in 1987, Open Circle has reached nearly half a million children and trained over 10,000 teachers, administrators and school support staff members. Open Circle is currently used in 262 schools across 98 communities in the Northeast.

SEL is the process of developing essential social and emotional skills, knowledge and attitudes related to:

- **Self-awareness:** recognizing one's emotions and values as well as one's strengths and limitations
- **Self-management:** managing emotions and behaviors to achieve one's goal
- **Social awareness:** showing and understanding empathy for others
- **Relationship skills:** forming positive relationships, working in teams, dealing effectively with conflict
- **Responsible decision-making:** making ethical, constructive choices about personal and social behavior

SEL helps children by promoting their health and well-being and contributing to the prevention of violence, truancy, bullying, and drug and alcohol abuse. In addition, SEL is associated with significant gains on academic achievement tests.

### Open Circle's Impact

Two research studies have demonstrated the substantial positive impact of Open Circle. The studies showed significant increases in children's self-assertiveness, higher levels of social skills and self-control, fewer problem behaviors, and fewer incidents of physical aggression. These findings were reiterated in a 2008 survey of 670 teachers who have participated in Open Circle training. A majority of participants reported:

- Students using Open Circle skills (e.g. calm breathing, distinguishing between dangerous/destructive and annoying behaviors) outside of Open Circle meetings.
- Increases in students' self-control, cooperation, problem solving, and effective communication.
- Decreases in teasing, bullying, and exclusion of peers.
- Spending more time on academics and less time on discipline.

Our core programs include both training and in-school coaching visits spaced across the school year to provide a cycle of learning, practice and reflection.
