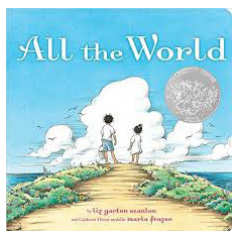


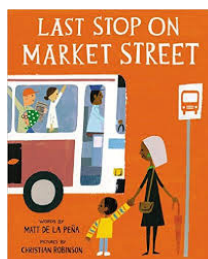
## Children's Books Related to Gratitude

The following stories and poetry collections describe characters that feel and express gratitude in different ways.



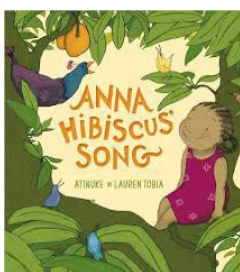
**All the World**, Liz Garton Scanlon (grades K-1)

**Anna Hibiscus' Song**, Atinuke (grades K-1)

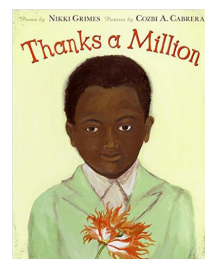
Anna reflects on the things in her life that make her happy. She asks members of her family how they express their happiness and their responses make Anna even happier and more content.

A collection of poems that include a range of voices expressing gratitude in different ways.



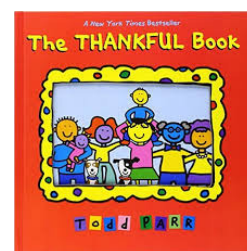
**Gracias – Thanks**, Pat Mora (grades 1-2)
