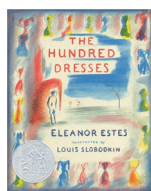


Open Circle’s “Top 25” List of Children’s Literature

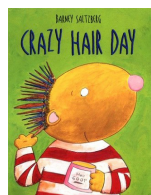
